FORWARD

The **H.E.A.R.T. Tactical Paramedic** is an essential part of a modern day Law Enforcement *Tactical Team* response. Essentially a *Medical Paramedic Specialist* cross trained in close quarters confrontation, and other *Special Operations*. Skill core elements include : explosive entry, combat rappelling, and defensive application of various firearms from pistol, rifle, shotgun, through submachine gun. The ** M.P.S. is trained and fully able to undertake comprehensive S.W.A.T. operational duties.

The **H.E.A.R.T. Tactical Paramedic** will be able to function as a fully trained member of the *Tactical Team*, able to administer critical first aid to *Team* personnel, in addition to any *Hostage* that has been injured. The M.P.S. is also immediately on scene to attend to any *Suspect* that has been incapacitated through use of deadly force. In many ways, reducing *Agency* liability, with regard to any injuries sustained during an operation.

In the critical medical response scenario seconds can be vital. The ability of *Personnel* to administer specialist assistance is invaluable, not least for *Team* moral. The M.P.S. is able to meet the requirements of a *dual role* in crisis scenarios, and negates the requirements for specific tactical protection from other *Team* members.

Emergency response scenarios are by their nature extremely unpredictable. We at *Sabre TTRR* believe that the **H.E.A.R.T.** syllabus offers a unique combination of the latest tactical training techniques, including the dynamic C.A.R. *Firearms Techniques*, currently sweeping through Law Enforcement Agencies throughout the USA. *The course syllabus includes :*

- ◇ Defensive firearms usage, and confrontational control techniques.
- ◇ Threat assessments, and tactical planning.
- ◇ Improvised explosive device recognition and appreciation.
- ◇ Explosive entry appreciation, and combat rappelling.
- ◇ Covert reconnaissance and information gathering.
- ◇ Tactical team advancement and crisis building entry.

The **H.E.A.R.T.** syllabus is a fully P.O.S.T. certified amalgamated course. Taught over a five day 40+ hours duration. *Students* are expected to be in possession of defensive firearms, tactical clothing, and be self sufficient with regard to personal equipment.

This course is *extremely physical* and very *hands on*. By definition there is little regard for creature comforts. *Students* should arrive ready to train. However a full choice of firearms and ammunition, are available if required.

Students can purchase various items of equipment prior to the course through *Sabre TTRR* that are considered essential. A list is available on request. Equipment for the school is also available for use during the school from *Sabre TTRR* at no charge.

This course has been designed to test an *Individual's* abilities, it is realistic, and will challenge the *Individuals* who attend it. In the real world there are no points for coming second.

This school promotes *Team Work* and builds “*Winners*”
