SPECIAL TACTICS AND RAID PLANNING FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

HIGH RISK ENCOUNTERS

This syllabus has been designed and constructed to offer a training system for a *Multi- Agency High Risk* planning and entry response. Many separate *Agencies*, such as D.E.A. / US Marshals / FBI / AFT, have developed their own expertise, it often requires a combined response, in order to undertake High Risk operations.

Should a *Hostage Situation* develop at a *Hospital* or *School* involving serious injury, high powered weapons and a fire, many *Agencies* would be required to combine their expertise. This syllabus offers Personnel the *C.R.O.P.s* containment system, in conjunction with *Tactical Planning* for S.W.A.T. and *Critical Entry Search and Capture* for Field Patrol Officers.

This system has its roots based on situations that have occurred in the *European theater*, such as *Northern Ireland*. Where sadly, all too regularly, *Terrorist* situations have brought about scenarios where the *Fire, Police*, and *Ambulance Services* have had to work together. Many times under threat of secondary explosive device. Always in very dangerous circumstances, and under continuing high risk, a joint cohesive plan must work.

The aftermath of which has carried the additional burden of evidential requirements, and Public Dis-order issues. Post September 11th 2001, has highlighted emergency response services inherent dangers, when combating *planned terrorism*, and a need for a joint emergency response.

This system is completely compatible with *Joint Agency Responses*, and has been designed specifically to deal with the aspects of :

- First Responder Personnel search and capture.*
- Immediate First Aid.*
- Setting up of an initial Control Point or I.C.P.*
- Information collation, and immediate tactical planning.*
- Public safety issues, including immediate area evacuation.*
- Criminal investigative requirements.*
- S.W.A.T. containment of armed and dangerous Suspects.*
- Improvised Explosive Devices - recognition and reaction.*
- Media Access and Control.*

Recently *Multi - Agency* critical incident scenarios have highlighted difficulties with *Joint Agency* responses, in particular has been *communications*, and *information* collation. This system works in a ***Crisis***, and if deployed will assist greatly with the *Safety* of all *First responders* and the *Public* at large.
