## COURSE INFORMATION

This is a one day eight (8) hour training session. On completion the Student will be fully certified in the tactical deployment of the SRS. They will be cognizant of the standards and procedures for N.E.T. ( *Non Lethal Extraction Techniques.* )

Full lesson Plans are available, and a CD will also be supplied to each participant on the training course. This training will be video taped, and a copy available to each Student for training references.

Students should wear Patrol Uniform, BDU, or full tactical protective equipment. Full *Tactical Protective* equipment can be supplied if required.

The Student will utilize inert Less Lethal 12 gauge ammunition. and inert OC Chemical agents, in conjunction with Tactical shield usage during deployment of the SRS system. Live *Role Players* will be utilized, protected by F.I.S.T. training gear.

Live munitions and chemical agents, will be utilized on mannequin subjects, in conjunction with the deployment of the SRS.

Students will be taught use of Force applications, and how to evidence techniques for Criminal Court Testimony.

Cost is \$75.00 per Student. SRS systems will be available for purchase on conclusion of training sessions. Training sessions can be conducted locally, or at various Regional Training centers located throughout USA.

## HISTORY OF THE SRS

The **SRS** was invented by Phil Jones, a *Control and Restraint* Instructor employed by the British Prison Service. It was identified by *Phil* that arresting officers were on occasions having significant difficulties restraining violent un co-operative individuals. This often resulted in either injuries to the arrest team, the prisoner, or indeed both.

The design challenge was to develop a system that would restrain an individual quickly and effectively without injury. After over a year in development the **SRS** was finally born. The **SRS** has now undergone numerous operation trials, and medical evaluations all of which it has passed outstandingly.

UK experience so far is with several UK Police forces and the Prison Service Juvenile estate, however the market is growing all of the time. Since the introduction in the UK we have found that litigation and complaints against Officers have reduced significantly. So far the **SRS** has caused no injuries what so ever and is even being used in the mental health field.

The USA have very similar problems to the UK, but are yet again unique in their approach. After the Mock Prison Riot 2003, the **SRS** was put through it's paces in near live scenarios. The **SRS** excelled at this event, and has been adopted by the Paul Castle Chief Instructor of the "*National Corrections Law Enforcement Training Technology Center*" located in West Virginia. The vision is for a safer working environment within all Law Enforcement and Corrections agencies, when dealing with violent or un co-operative individuals.
