VEHICLE INTERCEPTION PROCEDURES, EXTRACTION AND RESTRAINT

For years *Law Enforcement Personnel* have been taught to categorize vehicle stops as either a : *Felony or Misdemeanor*. Current training concepts teach that this equates into *High Risk or Low Risk*. This *Conceptual Thinking* has dictated *Officers* tactics, and often their *Mindsets*. It is a fact that most *Officers* who die, or who are seriously injured receive their injuries when conducting *Misdemeanor or Low Risk* stops.

The V.I.P.E.R. training syllabus, as part of *Sabre TTRR's ' Active Defense'* Strategy, has been written and designed to assist the *Patrol Officer* conduct "*Vehicle Stops*" in a systematic, progressive, and professional manner. All vehicle stops being considered as an "*UNKNOWN RISK* " situation.

The course also covers aspects of mental preparation for armed confrontations during such "*Unknown Risk Vehicle Stops.*" The V.I.P.E.R. training syllabus utilizes the C.A.R. TM 1995 firearms concepts, in conjunction with the "*Stinger*" spike system.

- ◇ This school is held over a three / four day period and deals with unknown risk stops involving trucks, semi's motor- cycles, vans, cars, S.U.V.s, and R.V.'s. Both day light and night-time scenarios are covered.
- ◇ Officers should be in possession of uniform and service weapons. 50 rounds of ammunition required for service weapon and 5 shotgun rounds.

The V.I.P.E.R. Syllabus can be designed to fit your Departmental requirements. Either '*Stop Sticks*' or the '*Stinger*' spiking system may be utilized. In essence this program is built around local requirements, and vehicles can be provided for the training sessions.
